

The Influence Of Room Head Supervision On Handover Effectiveness: Literature Review

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ABSTRACT

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Background: Handover is the process of transferring patient care responsibilities from one shift to the next. This process is important to ensure continuity of patient care and prevent medical errors. Supervision of the head of the room plays a very important role in the implementation of handover in the nursing department, and this is not only limited to supervision, but also includes aspects of coaching, monitoring and development for staff. **Method:** This research is a research using the literature review method of searching and compiling PICO analyzing 6 articles between 2018-2023 using the help of keywords, supervision and handover **Results:** The findings from the 6 articles resulting from the discussion show that there is an influence between the supervision of the head of the room and the handover because the better the supervision is carried out, the more effective the handover is (<). **Conclusion:** Supervision of the head of the room has a significant influence on the effectiveness of patient handovers. Supervision helps improve nurses' communication, knowledge, skills and motivation for successful handover **Suggestion:** The Head of the Room needs to periodically supervise the implementation of patient handovers..

INTRODUCTION

Handover is the process of transferring patient information and is a clinical responsibility between health practitioners another definition states that Handover is part of the nursing care process designed as a way of providing relevant information to nurses at each shift change, direction in providing information regarding the patient's condition, goals & treatment plans, medication and determining service priorities. The main function of handover is to ensure communication between nurses regarding patient information for continuity of patient care (Kerr, & McKinlay, 2013; Kilic, 2017). The quality and standards of planned and measurable health care can be achieved through planned roles and functions of

managers so that reliable manager skills are needed in managing them (Eggins & Slade, 2016). The handover carried out must comply with nursing care standards and requires supervision so that the implementation process and results can be assessed.

Handover is part of the process of providing nursing care by communicating between nurses during shift changes to provide information regarding the continuity of patient care and treatment. Handover contributes to patient safety, as in SNARS Edition 1 of 2018, especially in Standard SKP 2.2, it is stated that hospitals determine and implement the handover communication process, including several assessments (Eldemerdash, 2018). Nursing handover errors are still a serious problem in hospitals throughout the world, around 40% of medical errors in hospitals are caused by ineffective communication, including nursing handovers, where almost 70% of nurses have experienced handover errors (Institute of Medicine, 2022). In its study, JCI also found that around 60% of medical errors that occurred in the emergency room were caused by nursing handovers, all of which were detrimental to patients.

Nurse managers have a big role and responsibility in an organization. Nurse managers are responsible for translating the organization's strategic goals and objectives at the operational level into practice, not only being able to lead clinical care but also carrying out administrative roles and holding accountability for services in their work units 24 hours a day (Gunawan, Aunguroch, & Fisher, 2018). Clinical supervision is used as a tool to ensure a healthy work environment and encourage reflective experience and continuous development to achieve good nursing practice (Bateman, M, 2018). The focus of clinical supervision is to provide a basis for monitoring, assessing, and receiving feedback in the workplace, which can influence the development of professional skills (Eldemerdash, 2018). Supervision clinical practice seeks to provide an environment in which staff can reflect, evaluate and develop their clinical practice, effective clinical supervision improves the delivery of care services for patients who use Health services.

Patient handover must be carried out as effectively as possible by explaining briefly, clearly and completely about the nurse's independent actions, collaborative actions that have been carried out or not, and the patient's progress at that time. The information conveyed is accurate so that continuity of nursing care can run perfectly. The handover is carried out by the primary nurse on the previous shift to the primary nurse (in charge) on the next shift in writing or verbally. Clear communication is also needed about the client's needs regarding what interventions have been carried out and what have not, as well as the patient's response. The handover implementation in several hospitals in Indonesia is still not carried out optimally (Cahyaningtyaset al., 2020).

Based on the background described above, an effective way is needed to identify errors

in Handover. This study was conducted to review several literatures regarding the influence of Head of Room Supervision on the effectiveness of nurse handover). The purpose of this literature review is to determine the influence of supervision carried out by the Head of the Room on the Effectiveness of Patient Handovers


MATERIALS AND METHODS

This research is research using the literature review method, where this research uses a systematic, explicit, and reproducible method to identify, evaluate, and synthesize research and ideas produced by researchers and practitioners. The strategy used in this literature review search is by using a framework including pico ; P means population or problem, namely the ineffective handover of patients by nurses, I means intervention or action taken, namely supervision of the head of the room in the handover process, C means comparison or comparison, and O means outcome or result.

Keywords used in this study include "Supervision AND Handover Nursing". The data obtained is secondary data where data is obtained from the results of research that has been carried out previously. The sources obtained are articles or journals related to the topic discussed and obtained through search databases: Google Scholar, ProQuest, Scholar, PubMed and Science direct. All the articles obtained were published between 2018-2023 in either Indonesian or English and explain the influence of supervision on handover effectiveness.

After obtaining the articles, selection was carried out using inclusion criteria and exclusion criteria. Inclusion criteria include, research subjects are nurses in hospitals, full text manuscripts according to the research topic, while exclusion criteria are abstracts and manuscripts that cannot be accessed, and literature that does not match the topic. From the results obtained according to the inclusion criteria, there were 6 (4 national and 2 international articles) in the last 5 years from 2018-2023. The data obtained will be used as a discussion in this research

DISCUSSION

Handover is one of the activities providing nursing care provided must be in accordance with house standards pain so that the implementation process and results can be assessed. Nurse in carrying out mandatory nursing practice provide complete, honest, information correct, clear and easy to understand regarding nursing actions to clients and/or his family is within limits authority (RI Law No. 38, 2014). Hand over is a very important process in the implementation of nursing care because it is related to patient safety and continuity of nursing care to patients. Handover (patient handover) is the process of transferring the main authority and responsibility for providing clinical care to patients from one care provider to another to ensure continuity of care

through the process of exchanging information and transferring responsibility for patient care (Riedel & Ayala, 2017) .

Supervision of the head of the room as an effort to maintain the quality of care, compliance with procedures and guarantee better nursing services. Supervision activities are planning, organizing, actuating and controlling. Being a supervisor is an inherent role and if this activity is carried out well it will have a positive impact and satisfaction, not only for the supervisor himself but for the room nurses and patients. (Maria Haryati, 2019). Research conducted by Adriana Hada PhD candidate, MN, RN et al (2020) shows that guidance interventions carried out by leaders, role models carried out by leaders and the provision of material about handovers are effective in increasing patient safety by reducing the number of falls and the rate of pressure injuries. , and medication errors. The implication is that implementation of strategies or changes in care practices can have a positive impact on quality of care and patient safety in acute care settings. With adjustment for differences across wards, these results provide a strong basis for supporting continuity and improvement of care practices. So that the research can be applied in nursing practice.

Subsequent research conducted by Dewi Brown-Deveaux, DNP ect (2020) overall, the results showed positive support from nurses for the implementation of bedside handover. Improvements in preference, perceived efficiency, and benefits to patients and communications suggest that this method may be a valuable option. However, challenges such as privacy concerns and shift overlap remain a focus for further improvement in efforts to improve care practices. Dewi stated that the main strength of this project was empowering several high-performing nurses to become agents of change. These nurses served as leaders in developing and disseminating project goals to their colleagues.

In research conducted by Deny Gunawan, et al (2021) emphasizes the importance of the head nurse to provide clear and accurate clinical information and guidance to nurses, organize and direct the nurse's work flow to ensure a smooth handover, organize schedules and resources that support the implementation of a successful handover. efficient. These results are in line with research conducted by Aini Nadhifah,

Rokiah Kusumapradja, Nofierni (2022), which shows that the role of the unit head, workload, and implementation of nurse-pharmacy handover are important factors in improving patient safety culture in hospitals. Unit heads who play an active role in supporting the implementation of nurse-pharmacy handovers can increase the effectiveness of handovers, which in turn can improve patient safety culture. Similar research was conducted by Wiwin Sulistyawati, Arif Nurma Etika, Restu Novitasari, (2020) and Detta Trinesa, Yulastri Arif, Dewi Murni (2020). In their research it can be concluded that the implementation of head nurse supervision is related to the quality of handover between shifts in hospital inpatient rooms.

The six articles discussed have the same topic, namely supervision and handover. Although in the fourth to sixth studies there was no intervention carried out by the researchers. Some of the advantages of the articles are that the samples are quite large (articles 1, 3, and 4), the measurements are objective (article 1), showing the concrete impact of the intervention on nursing practice, an important contribution to the development of patient safety culture in hospitals. (articles 1,2 and 4), using quasi and cross-sectional methods (articles 1, 3,4,5,6). The weakness obtained is that research is usually carried out in one hospital so that it is necessary to carry out research (retest) in another hospital, no intervention is carried out after knowing the influence of the head of the room on the implementation of the handover (articles 3, 4, 5, and 6

CONCLUSIONS

From the six articles discussed, it can be concluded that headroom supervision has a significant influence on the effectiveness of patient handovers. Supervision can be carried out in several ways, namely, increasing the knowledge and skills of implementing nurses in carrying out handovers, creating a work environment that is conducive to carrying out handovers and detecting and overcoming problems in carrying out handovers.

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
